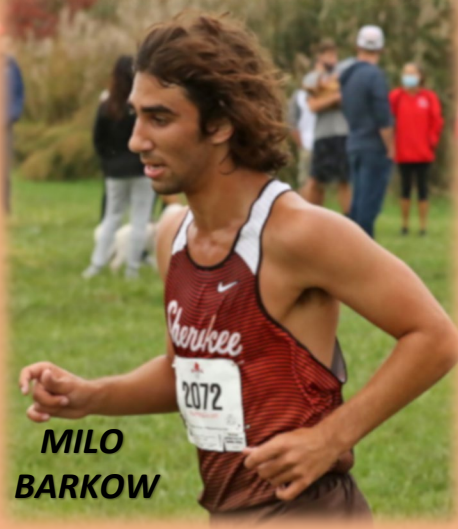

Last year at this time we were celebrating a tremendously successful 2019 cross country campaign, having won county, conference, sectional and state championships. Led by a terrific senior class, we knew it was our time and we came through with one of the most successful seasons in the history of Cherokee Cross Country. While we also knew we were losing an incredibly talented senior class, we were optimistic. A good winter and spring track season could set us up for a great summer of training and we could roll that into cross country 2020!

A lot can change in a year . . .

Thank you, Covid . . .

Goodbye Spring Track. Hello remote education . . .

So, in a year like no other year, we really had to think about doing what was **necessary**. Each of us . . .okay, each of you . . . had to train with no guarantee of racing. It was not fun. It was hard. It was, at times, demoralizing. But it was **necessary**.

Once we entered the summer, NJSIAA plans for the fall season began to take shape. On the plus side, there would be a season! On the minus, it would not be a normal season.

Still, it allowed us to set goals and develop a plan. We were no longer in limbo, just doing what was necessary without any clear idea of why. We began doing what was **possible** . . . working toward a season that would encompass three batch meets, two SJTCA meet and three championship races – the Olympic Conference Championship, the Burlington County Championship and the South Jersey Group 4 Sectional Championship.

Led by senior captains, **Brett Shea** and **Nico Grilli**, we knew we had strength up front. What we did not know was who would replace the other five members of last year's varsity seven who had moved on. Could we put together a team capable of competing for conference, county and sectional championships? Perhaps a county championship was realistic but, given what rival Cherry Hill East was returning, many thought it would be **impossible** to win the conference and sectional races.

As the summer went by and we moved into September, we recognized that there was real potential among the group of 28 athletes on the squad. Each class had much to offer.

In the senior class, in addition to **Grilli** and **Shea**, **Dylan Odud** was entering the season in very good shape having had his best summer of training ever. And, while they had both had health issues over the past year, **Milo Barkow** and **Christian Bennett** were coming in ready to give all that they had to the team.

Among the junior class, **Bradley Popler** stood out. He was clearly in the best shape of his life and was training with focus and intent. He looked ready to contend for a varsity spot! **Aiden Dickinson**, **Jameson Crozier** and **Joe Natoli** all looked to be in the mix, each with the talent to get there. It would just depend on staying healthy and training consistently. Even our track duo of **Lucas Hatch** and **Kevin Hess** came into the season ready to work! Track may be their passion, but they were going to put their all into the cross country season.

In the sophomore class, **Conor Jacob**, **Patrick Ditmars** and **Tommy Bromley** all looked fit and ready to roll! All three were certainly part of the conversation as to who would fill those varsity spots! **Joe Hough** was perhaps the biggest surprise of the class. Having trained consistently through the pandemic he had transformed himself into a competitive runner and it appeared he would now be knocking on the door of the varsity seven! The other returner from this class, **Danny Hassall**, had done his running and would also be looking for improvement. Newcomer, **Ethan Weisenberg**, had trained diligently and was excited to join the team while fellow newcomer, **Nick Campbell** was, unfortunately, sidelined early with an injury.

And then there was the freshman class . . . A group that brought not only talent, but a great attitude to the mix! **Nick Kuenkel**, **Andrew Free**, **Matteo Evola**, **Julian Hatch**, **Luke Reistle**, **Bobby Poplau**, **Silas Matteson**, **Nate Meyer**, **Jack Delaney** and **Nimai Kumar** were a group that very much reminded us of last year's senior class when they were freshmen. You know . . . that class that went on to win a state championship. As a coaching staff, we admired their ability but, even more, we appreciated their great attitudes! While they gave us cause to look to the future with excitement, it was apparent that their addition to our team would make a difference even this season.

And so, with renewed excitement after months of isolation, we began to dream of championships! Slowly those dreams became goals and, ultimately, a training plan was put into place to get there. We had done the necessary. We were doing the possible.

The next step was to take a stab at *the impossible*.

When the racing season began in October, we got our first dose of reality in Batch Meet #1 where we matched up against Cherry Hill East, ranked #4 in the state in the Milesplit Preseason Poll. East showed their strength with a convincing win, putting three runners in front of our second and six in front of our fourth. Proof to some that our goal of beating East at the Conference and/or Sectional Meets was impossible. Evidence to us that we had more work to do but we had a shot if we stayed focused and determined.

Batch Meet #2 was another challenge for us as we faced a very good Washington Township team who came into the competition ranked fourth in South Jersey while we were ranked third. The meet was as close as expected and we were just able to slip by the Minutemen by a mere two points, thanks to significant improvement from week one by all seven runners.

We held out our top six runners in Batch Meet #3 to prepare for the upcoming conference championship race. In addition, we were missing two others from our top ten, **Joe Natoli** (who would miss the rest of the season due to injury) and **Joe Hough**. Despite this, we were still able to finish second, just five points behind Shawnee, South Jersey's eight ranked team.

Over the course of the three batch meets, we were not only able to get a read on the strength of our varsity squad and what would be required to contend at the championships, we also demonstrated the depth of this team as we went undefeated in the three JV races. Now it was time for the championship season!

As we took to the course on October 24th for the Olympic Conference Championship, we knew we had to run our best to have a shot at the victory. The varsity team responded with a great race. Unfortunately, it was not quite the perfect race we needed for a win over Cherry Hill East as they held on for a three-point victory. The most notable performances of the meet were turned in by two sophomores, **Conor Jacob** and **Patrick Ditmars**, both of whom set new 5k PRs! While disappointed not to win, we took solace in the fact that we had significantly closed the gap on East, which gave us hope for sectionals! The JV team also came up a bit short as East ran a strong race to take that title and relegate us to second place in both competitions.

The following week was an off week for the JV squad while the varsity traveled to the Rancocas Valley Athletic Complex for the Burlington County Open, a meet we had won each of the previous six years and 19 times in the last 25 years. This year was to be no different as we once again finished first with 35 points, 45 fewer than runner-up, Shawnee! The senior captains were the stars of this show as they took first and second individually. **Nico Grilli** led the way with the individual victory, making him the 10th County Champion in school history, while **Brett Shea** continued his steady improvement, running his best race yet for second! With two weeks until Sectionals, we were moving in the right direction!

While the varsity squad prepared for Sectionals, the rest of the team were back at Dream Park for two SJTCA Meets.

The first took place on a beautiful sunny Saturday. With the top seven not in attendance and several others out with injuries, the team still acquitted itself well, finishing 6th in a field of 11 in the varsity race and winning the JV race against a somewhat depleted field. The most notable performance of the day came from freshman, **Luke Reistle**, who won the JV competition and improved his 5k PR by almost 20 seconds in the process!

The second SJTCA meet included a freshman race along with a JV competition. By this point in the year, the challenge of running every meet at Dream Park was beginning to take a toll on the squad. All the athletes were doing their best to fight off the growing fatigue of the season. The freshman race went first and even without top frosh, **Nick Kuenkel** (training with the varsity for sectionals), the team took the victory, led by second place finisher, **Julian Hatch**. The only PR in the race was recorded by **Silas Matteson** who, despite the fatigue of the long season, dropped almost a half a minute off of his previous best! With the freshmen running separately, the JV team was a little depleted but still had some good performances as they placed second, once again behind a strong Cherry Hill East squad. The best race of the group came from junior, **Aiden Dickinson**, who tied his previous 5k PR to finish fifth, neck and neck with teammate, **Joe Hough**, in fourth!

And so, it now all came down to one race . . . The South Jersey Group 4 Sectional Championship. The most important race of the season given that states and MOCs were cancelled due to Covid. Four of the top 16 ranked teams in the state were in the field - #6 Cherry Hill East, #11 Cherokee, #14 Southern and #16 Washington Township. This was our moment! How would we respond?

On race day, the first thing of note was the horrible condition of the course. After 3 days of rain, the DREAM Park course (which is questionable on a good day) looked more like Nightmare Park! With seven races having run before us, we took to the course under the worst conditions of the day. There was no way to avoid the mud, the divots and the standing water on the sloppy, soft, slow course!

Despite the tough course conditions, the boys appeared excited, confident and determined! However, when the gun went off, Cherry Hill East surged aggressively and, at the first mile, had a decisive advantage with Southern in second and us third, with Washington Township close on our heels. Our motto all year was to run smart in the first half of the race and tough in the second half. We hoped that was the strategy the seven Cherokee runners were following.

It was . . .

By mile two, we were in second place and the gap had closed on East. You could see and feel the determination as each Cherokee runner passed by!

Mile three is where it really came together . . .

Nico Grilli was in third with several runners right behind him. He was clearly hurting but was determined to hold his spot. He did just that, crossing the line in third place!

Brett Shea was dialed in over the last part of the race! He passed several runners in that space, including East's top two, to take sixth!

Sophomore, **Patrick Ditmars**, was on fire! A look of determination was etched in his face and he moved up nicely to secure eleventh place with a new 5k PR despite the sloppy course!

Behind Patrick, senior **Dylan Odud** was finishing out his cross country career in style! He too had a look of intense determination as he moved up steadily and sprinted by one last runner at the line to place twelfth!

Although fifth man, **Conor Jacob**, was not having his best day, he absolutely refused to give up! He knew his teammates needed him and he was not going to let them down. Conor hung tough over the last half mile, holding off challenges from several runners to secure sixteenth place, giving us five runners in front of East's fourth!

Sixth man, Freshman, **Nick Kuenkel**, was also on his way to a great performance as he passed East's fifth man in the last stages of the race and just missed getting East's fourth runner at the line, establishing a new 5k PR in the process!

Finally, seventh man, **Bradley Popler**, did his part for the team. Like Conor, Bradley also wasn't having his *best* day. However, he gave all he had on *this* day! He finished in front of the seventh runner from 12 of the 13 teams in the race and beat top-five runners from 11 of the 13 teams! A fitting conclusion to an almost perfect team race!

After doing what was necessary and then what was possible, this team finally accomplished *the seemingly impossible*!

If not *impossible*, at least *improbable*. After all, East returned Six of their top seven runners from last year's team that finished 4th in the Group 4 State Meet and 8th at the Meet of Champions, while we had five new runners in our top seven this year. This upset victory was a tribute to the focus, determination and toughness exhibited this season, not just from the seven sectional racers, but from the entire team!

As your coaches, we are immensely proud of you!

Thank you, **seniors**, for your hard work and dedication over the years! You have made a positive impact on the Cherokee Cross Country Program and we are forever grateful. Please know that, whatever we accomplish in the coming years, you are, and will always be, a part of it . . .

For those of you returning: The future looks bright! Although this year's seniors will be hard to replace, it is their time to move on and your time to step up. Like Teddy Roosevelt said: *Believe you can and you're halfway there!* What do you believe you can accomplish? Dream big! Then . . . turn that dream into a plan and start working. You will get there!

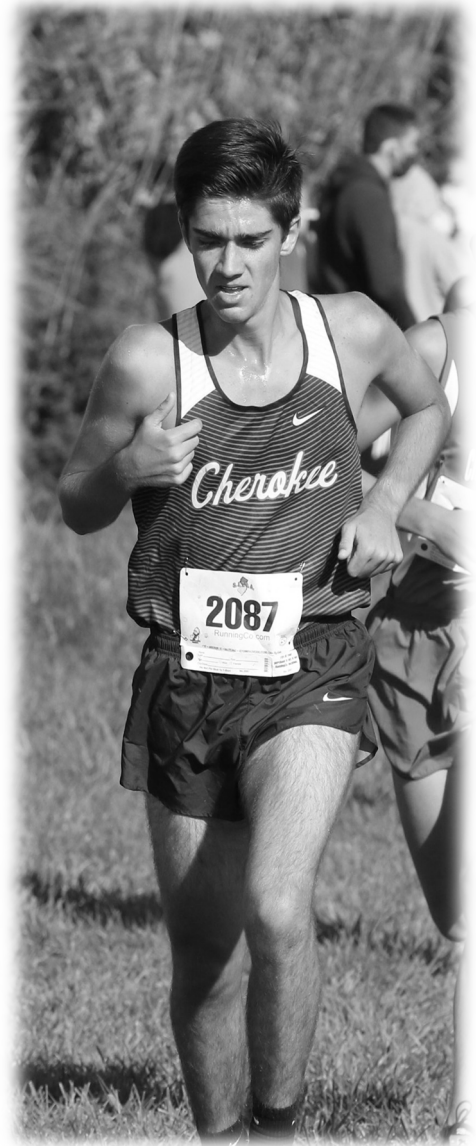

Cherry Hill East, Cherokee boys mix it up in season-opening XC showdown!!!!

Cherry Hill East, ranked No. 4 in the state, opened its 2020 XC season by placing six runners at in the top 10 in a seven-team Olympic Conference batch meet Saturday.

Seniors Aidan Groff, Gabe Rodriguez and Aidan Eyre placed 2nd, 3rd and 4th of 46 finishers, Groff in 16:17, Rodriguez 16:20 and Eyre 16:39 for East.

Cherokee senior Nico Grilli was the overall winner, covering the 5,000-meter layout at DREAM Park in Logan Township in 16:11.

Rounding out the 10 top were Camden Catholic senior Aeden Rosolia [5th in 16:43], Cherokee senior Brett Shea [6th in 16:48], Cherry Hill East sophomore Michael McCurdy [7th in 16:51], Cherokee sophomore Conor Jacob [8th in 16:54], then junior Dylan Hagan [9th in 17:04] and senior Justin Whitney [10th in 17:14], both of Cherry Hill East.

Cherokee packed the next four finishers, all under 18 minutes – senior Dylan Odud [17:22], sophomore Patrick Ditmars [17:47], junior Bradley Poplar [17:48] and sophomore Thomas Bromley [17:51].

Team scoring wasn't kept, but unofficially Cherry Hill East would have finished with a 25-38 margin over Cherokee.

Nico Grilli runs all-time #5 time at DREAM Park for Cherokee in Olympic Conference batch meet!!!

Cherokee senior Nico Grilli ran a personal best 16:01 on the DREAM Park course and was the first finisher in the seven-team Olympic Conference batch meet by over 100 meters Saturday morning.

Grilli's previous PR on the Logan Township 5,000-meter course was 16:09 last October at the Olympic Conference Championships.

His 16:01 ties him for No. 5 performer in the three years the course has been used for major competitions.

Junior Billy Clewell of Camden Catholic, a first-year XC runner, placed second in 16:24.

Although team scoring wasn't kept, Cherokee would have edged Washington Township 35-37 if it was.

Cherokee went 1-3-7-10-14, and Township went 4-5-8-9-11-13.

Cherokee also had senior Brett Shea [3rd in 16:28], sophomore Conor Jacob [7th in 16:52] and senior Dylan Odud [10th in 17:01] in the top 10.

Washington Township was led by seniors Cole Kolodziej [4th in 16:28] and Julian Lawson [6th in 16:29], with senior Mason Brewster [8th in 16:55] and junior Chris Colavita [9th in 16:59] also in the top 10.

Lenape sophomore Jake Buniva finished 6th in 16:50.

Aidan Groff leads Cherry Hill East to 3-point win in Olympic Conference American!!!!

Senior Aidan Groff ran 16:05, and Cherry Hill East packed its five scorers in 49 seconds to win the Olympic Conference American Division XC title Saturday.

Cherry Hill East finished with a 42-45 advantage over Cherokee at DREAM Park in Logan Township, and Washington Township was third with 59 points.

The 16:05 is an all-course 5K personal best for Groff, who ran 16:10 earlier this month at Buck Mill Park in Colts neck. His previous PR was 16:17, also earlier this month.

Groff moves up to No. 8 in course history and No. 2 in Cherry Hill East history, behind Oliver Adler's 15:54 at last year's Olympic Conference meet.

Senior Gabe Rodriguez was 5th in 16:23 and senior Aidan Eyre 10th in 16:37. East juniors Dylan Hagan [12th in 16:38] and Ethan Anderer [14th in 16:54] also scored, and 6th man sophomore Michael McCurdy was 15th in 16:55.

Seniors Nico Grillo and Brett Shea and sophomore Conor Jacob ran 2nd, 6th and 7th for Cherokee in 16:07, 16:24 and 16:33. Dylan Odud and Patrick Ditmars rounded out Cherokee's pack, Odud in 13th in 16:52 and Ditmars 17th in 17:00. Jacob's time was an all-course 5K PR by 28 seconds and Ditmars' by 16 seconds.

Also in the top 10 were Washington Township senior Julian Lawson [3rd, 16:11, 18-second all-course PR], Shawnee senior John Ruona [4th, 16:14], Washington Township senior Cole Kolodziej [8th in 16:33] and Minuteman junior Chris Colavita [9th in 16:37, 22-second all-course PR].

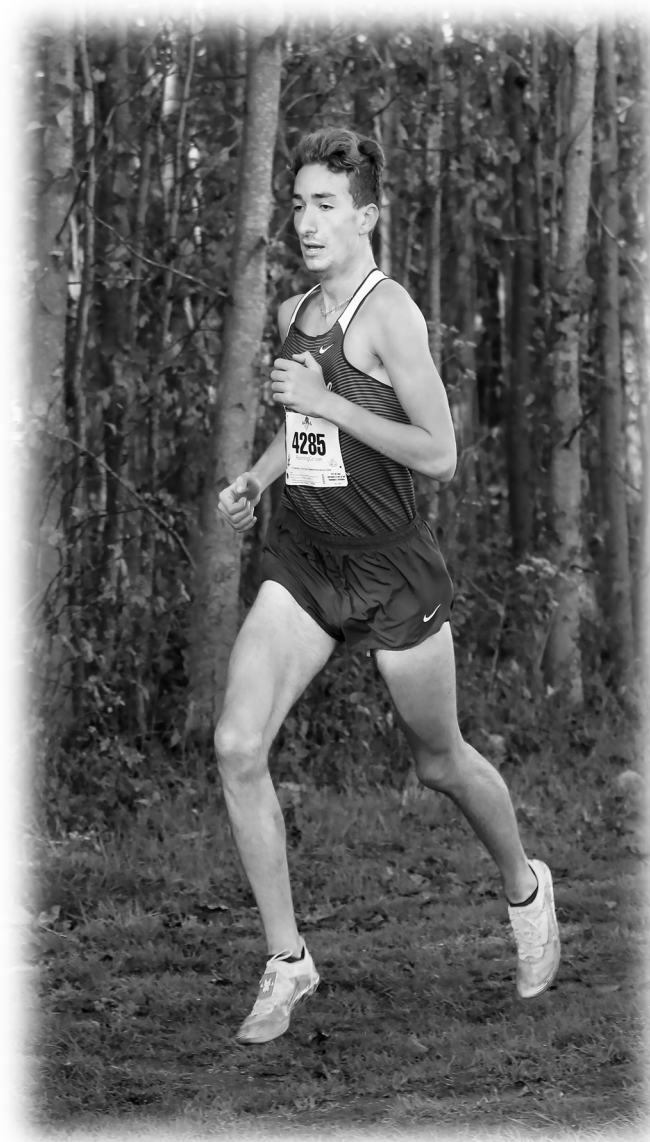

Grilli's victory propels Cherokee to 7th straight county crown

MOUNT HOLLY >> The Cherokee High School boys cross country team continued its reign in the county - evident by its individual and team titles - at the Burlington County Open championships Oct. 31 here. Senior captain Nico Grilli led the field of 66 finishers with a winning time of 16:28 for his first Open crown at the Rancocas Valley Sports Complex. Senior captain Brett Shea was in second place 13 seconds later at 16:41 to help the Chiefs to their seventh consecutive county team title with 35 points. Cherokee has won the county championships 20 times in the last 26 years and 22 times in school history. Grilli's win marks the 10th time since 1995 that Cherokee has had an individual county champion, joining Tim Haggerty (1995), Marc Pelerin (2001), Keith Krieger (2002), Alex Yersak (2006, 2007), Shawn Wilson (2012), Nick Falk (2014, 2015) and Justin Kelly (2017). And for the first time since 2000 when it was at Freedom Park in Medford, the Open was held somewhere other than the famed Mill Creek Park "hill" course in Willingboro. "It was weird to compete for the county championship at a course other than Mill Creek," said Cherokee coach Jeff Thompson, whose school also hosted the open from 1994 to 1988. "However, in a year that continually reminds us that we aren't in control, we're grateful for every opportunity we are given to compete, and Saturday was no exception. From what we have seen, the Rancocas Valley course runs fairly fast, but the wet conditions leading up to the race - and the sub-32 temperatures the night before - made for a slower course."

Finishing behind Grilli and Shea for the Chiefs were: senior Dylan Odud (7th; 17:03), sophomore Patrick Ditmars (12th; 17:18), sophomore Conor Jacob (13th; 17:24) and junior Tyler Popler (17th; 17:32).

"We came in (to the open) liking our chances to win the meet, but with the other talented runners in Burlington County, we were careful not to take anything for granted," said Thompson, whose team a week

earlier finished second to Cherry Hill East in the Olympic Conference championships. “Nico and Brett ran smart races, finishing in first and second place, helping us achieve our team goal.”

Seniors Nico Grilli and Brett Shea ran 1-2 to lead Cherokee to its seventh straight Burlington County Open XC title.

It's also Cherokee's 19th team title in the last 24 years.

Grilli ran 16:28 and Shea 16:41 over the 5,000-meter course at the Rancocas Valley Athletic Complex in Eastampton.

It was the first time the race was held at a site other than Mill Creek Park in Willingboro in 40 years. It was held at Burlington County College in Pemberton from its inception in 1970 until 1979.

For Cherokee, senior Dylan Odud ran 17:03 for 7th, sophomore Patrick Ditmars 17:17 for 12th and sophomore Conor Jacob 7:24 for 13th.

Cherokee outscored second-place Shawnee 35-80, with Moorestown third with 91 points. The second place is Shawnee's best finish since 2006, when the Renegades won the team title 56-63 over Seneca. Third place is Moorestown's best team finish since it was second to Cherokee in 2014.

Senior John Ruona led second-place Shawnee in third with a 16:48, and senior Robert Birdsall [14th in 17:29] and junior Alex Campagna [18th in 17:38] were also in the top 20.

Ruona's 3rd-place finish is the best by a Shawnee runner at the County Open since Connor Herr won the 2011 race.

Moorestown placed sophomores Paul Kresloff [5th in 17:00] and Colin Shand [8th in 17:13] in the top 10.

Kresloff's finish is the highest at the County Open by a Moorestown runner since Joe Inglis took 4th in the 2012 race.

Also in the top 10 were junior Rancocas Valley Andre Faigal [4th in 16:55], Cinnaminson sophomore Alex Boyko [6th in 17:01] and Lenape junior Jake Buniva [9th in 17:15] and sophomore Colin Hermack [10th in 17:15].

Cherokee tops Cherry Hill East & Southern in tight battle between three N.J. top-15 teams!!!

Cherokee packed its five scorers in 40 seconds Saturday and rolled to its 10th sectional title Saturday and second in a row.

Seniors Nico Grilli and Brett Shea led the way for the Chiefs, Grilli in 3rd in 16:28 and Shea in 6th in 16:33 over the water-logged 5K DREAM Park course in Logan Township.

The race featured three of the state's top-14 ranked teams going in: No. 6 Cherry Hill East, No. 11 Cherokee and No. 14 Southern Regional.

Cherokee outscored Cherry Hill East 48-63, with Southern third on a 6th-runner tiebreaker with Cherry Hill East.

Cherokee went 3-6-11-12-16, Southern 1-4-14-21-23 and Cherry Hill East 7-8-10-18-20. Cherry Hill East had beaten Cherokee by three in the Olympic Conference Championships last month.

Sophomore Patrick Ditmars, senior Dylan Odud and sophomore Conor Jacob clinched the win for the Chiefs, Ditmars 11th in 16:53, Odud 12th in 16:54 and Jacob 16th in 17:08. Freshman Nick Kuenkel was Cherokee's sixth finisher, 19th in 17:16, and junior Bradley Popler also raced, taking 36th in 17:44.

This is the first time Cherokee has won consecutive sectional titles since 1999 and 2000, when the Chiefs won their fourth and fifth in a row. Cherokee also won SJ-4 titles in 2007, 2011, 2016 and 2019. The Chiefs went on to win the state title last year.

Cherokee's 10 sectional titles trails only Haddonfield [40], Haddon Township [20] and Cinnaminson [12] among South Jersey schools and is most among South Jersey Group 4 schools, three more than Cherry Hill East and Toms River North.

Southern's Jackson Braddock, the state Group 4 champion last year and an 8:54 two-miler on the track, won the race in 16:02, matching Brady Shute of Gateway-Woodbury for fastest time of the day [The FAT camera gave Shute a 2-100ths-of-a-second edge, 16:02.97 to 16:02.99.]

Clearview senior Anas Bensaoud ran 16:25 for 2nd, and Washington Township senior Julian Lawson was 5th at 16:31. Seniors Gabe Rodriguez and Aidan Eyre took 7th and 8th for Cherry Hill East in 16:39 and 16:43, Egg Harbor Township senior Nick Valdivieso was 9th in 16:48, and Aidan Groff of Cherry Hill East took 10th in 16:52.

LOGAN TWP. >> Cherokee successfully defended its team title at the NJSIAA South Boys Cross Country Sectional Championships Nov. 14 at the Gloucester County DREAM Park here.

The Chiefs placed its five scoring runners among the top 16 finishers for a 48-point total to best a field of 14 teams in Group 4. Cherokee averaged 16:47 and had a 41-second split between its first and fifth finishers. Cherry Hill East and Southern Regional were second and third, respectively, each with a score of 63.

“We could not be happier with how the team ran at sectionals,” said Cherokee coach Jeffrey Thompson.

“Looking at those who were returning, we knew that Cherry Hill East was going to be very tough to beat this season, but I can’t say enough about how focused and determined this group of young men was going back to the spring. They chose to work hard each day, even when circumstances dictated that

they couldn't have the benefit of running with others. That same focus and determination was seen as the race unfolded at sectionals - to a man, they ran smart, not getting pulled out too fast, and then ran the last one-and-a-half to two miles with a lot of grit, passing quite a few runners."

Senior Nico Grilli was the first runner to cross the finish line for the Chiefs, placing third overall behind Southern Regional senior Jackson Braddock (16:03) and Clearview senior Anas Bensaoud (16:25), in 16:28.

Senior Brett Shea was too far off Grilli's pace, coming in five seconds later at sixth place in 16:33.

"Nico and Brett have been great leaders for us this year, and they stepped up yet again at sectionals," said Thompson.

Sophomore Patrick Dimars (16:53) and senior Dylan Odud (16:54) came in together at 11th and 12th place, respectively.

"Brett and Dylan got better every race this season, and were a dry course away from lifetime personal records," said Thompson. "Patrick really came through for the team, dropping seven seconds off of his PR on a very messy day."

Sophomore Conor Jacob was 16th out of 102 runners in 17:06, followed by freshman Nick Kuenkel (18th; 17:16) and junior Bradley Popler (36th; 17:44).

Several days of rain, coupled with the fact that the Group 4 boys race was the last of eight on the day, made for a messy, muddy 3.1-mile course at the sectionals.

"Dream Park doesn't drain too well, so we knew that the course was going to be sloppy," said Thompson. "We accepted that early in the week, and wanted to have fun in those conditions. The footing deteriorated over the course of the day, and since we were in the eighth of eight races on the course, our times were slowed down a decent amount, but our goal was to race the competition not the watch."

In a normal year, the Chiefs would be moving on to the state championships. But the COVID-19 pandemic forced the NJSIAA to cancel all competitions beyond the sectional level for safety reasons.

“We’re disappointed to not have the chance to compete against the best Group 4 teams in the state, but we understand the circumstances of the year, and are appreciative of the opportunity we had to represent Cherokee High School at the South Jersey Group 4 Championship and come home with the title,” said Thompson. “Doing so 25 minutes after the girls team won their race made for the perfect day.”

Cherokee other’s South Jersey sectional titles came in 1988 (52 points), 1997 (80), 1998 (61), 1999 (55), 2000 (52), 2007 (52), 2011 (73), 2016 (60) and last year (42).

History in the making

Despite losing top runners to graduation and COVID challenges, Cherokee's boys and girls ran to South Jersey championships in the same season for the first time in school history.

In a season and preseason filled with starts and stops, Cherokee High School's cross-country teams pushed forward and never looked back.

When the first team practice came late in the summer, as COVID restrictions relaxed, "it felt like Christmas morning," said boys' coach Jeff Thompson. The Chiefs lost a good bit of talent to graduation the previous spring — including four runners who placed in the top 14 at the South Jersey Group 4 meet in 2019 — but Thompson liked the leadership Niko Grilli and Brett Shea were showing off early.

"I don't think they can adequately state what they meant to the team and how great of a job they did in keeping the team organized, in a way that a coach can never do, even under normal circumstances," Thompson said. "In abnormal circumstances, they really were the glue for the team that the coaches could really rely on in the spring and the summer, setting the tone with their training, the way they went about their business and stayed focused and motivated."

As he saw his own, new-look girls team work together, Cherokee coach Mark Jarvis was excited with the promise, too. But, realistically, he thought competing for a sectional title "was a long shot."

That didn't stop one of his assistants, Dave Patruzzi, from yelling it out one day in mid-September as the team went over its goals for the season.

"He was just throwing that out there to get them to think big," Jarvis said of a team that didn't have any seniors in its top seven and had a few freshmen relatively new to the sport.

"But as we saw them race and began to see the season unfold," Jarvis continued, "it became more evident that that was going to be a possibility."

Cherokee's cross-country teams made history in 2020. On Nov. 14, both the girls and boys teams ran their way to sectional titles in the South Jersey Group 4 meet at DREAM Park in Logan Township.

It's the first time in school history that both teams are South Jersey champions in the same season.

“One of the things that made this year so special, for both of us, is neither team came into the season as the favorite,” Thompson noted. “We both came in as the underdog. So you have that challenge, and the number of challenges everyone all across the country faced with COVID-19.

“To know that you’re doing things that have enabled you to be the best in your region, in your section, is a really great feeling,” he added. “And, on my end, to share that with the others I work with, it’s really cool, to see as a program we’re going in the same direction.”

For the Cherokee girls, the sectional championship was the first for the team since 2003, the year before their most veteran runner on this year’s team, junior Nicole Clifford, was born. After finishing fourth in 2017, third in 2018 and second in 2019, the Chiefs reached the top with a dominating effort: Five of the first eight girls who reached the finish line were from Cherokee, led by freshman Kerry O’Day.

“I was just glad I finished,” said O’Day, who finished second overall behind Cherry Hill East’s Alexis Tepper. “And then I realized the whole team was right behind me and I knew we were going to do well. And that was cool.”

Right behind O’Day were sophomore Kelsey Niglio (third), Clifford (fourth), and fellow freshmen Olivia Parkinson (seventh) and Alaina Bromley (eighth). Junior Nicole Falzone (15th) and freshman Allison Rathman (17th) also finished in the top 20 as the Chiefs collected 24 team points to beat Cherry Hill East (61).

“It’s so awesome,” Clifford said of the team title. “To know you have a team where maybe you don’t run your best race but you have all of those girls to back you up — it’s an amazing feeling. It doesn’t even compare to running individually. Having all of those girls there, having your back, it makes you that much stronger mentally and physically. It was awesome.”

On the boys side, Brett Shea said this year’s sectional win was more exciting than last year, when the Chiefs won the Group 4 state championship.

Part of that was because the state meet was somewhat anticlimactic, since a computer snafu caused an hours-long wait to see the results. But it was also because expectations weren’t quite the same this year, with three of the top six runners from last year’s sectional meet (and four of the top 14) members of Cherokee’s Class of 2020 last summer.

And Cherokee finished second to Cherry Hill East in the Olympic Conference meets just a few weeks before sectionals.

“The whole season we were preparing for sectionals,” Shea said “The whole time. We want to peak here, we want to peak here. So we knew we had to take the extra precautions to stay healthy, staying away from people and making that sacrifice with our social life for the greater good. We knew that we wanted to win sectionals really badly.”

Shea finished sixth, behind fellow senior Grilli (third) and in front of sophomore Patrick Ditmars (11th), Dylan Odud (12th) sophomore Conor Jacob (16th) and freshman Nick Kuenkel (18th), as Cherokee racked up 48 points to beat East and Southern (both had 63 points) and win back-to-back South Jersey titles for the first time in 20 years.

“It was a great feeling,” Shea said. “I came across the line and turned around and I saw our guys pulling in and I actually started tearing up.”

“It really showed the hard work we had put out,” Grilli added. “Because we knew we were losing a bunch of great guys, but we also knew we had a ton of potential. ... We formed a great work ethic and (the new runners) worked hard. It meant a lot for all of that to show.”
